WORD FROM FR BERNIE

Towards the end of 2019, Pope Francis instituted a Sunday of the Word of God. This was put down for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. He chose this date because it is close to when the Week of Prayer for Chris8an Unity is celebrated in the northern hemisphere. This timing is quite impractical for Australia. The dates get mixed up with the final weeks of the summer holidays, the return to school and the celebration of Australia Day. The Australian bishops decided to change the date so that it could be emphasised as a day of great importance whilst keeping it close to Pope Francis' day, hence the first Sunday in February.

The Importance of the Word of God. There have been two documents about Scripture released in recent times by the Holy See on 30 September – one in 2019 and the other in 2020. They mark the 1600th anniversary of the death of St Jerome, the great Scripture scholar who prepared the definitive translation of the Bible into Latin. The first document institutes the Sunday of the Word of God, intended to help people to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures. The second gives an account of St Jerome, his scholarship, his faith and his "living and tender love" of the Word of God. Jerome is proposed as a model for inculturating the Gospel and discovering Christ for our time.

The day presents an opportunity to encourage people/us to read, appreciate and pray daily with sacred Scripture, especially through the practice of *lectio divina*. One of the primary ways in which the faithful honour God's Word in the liturgy is by faithfully listening to the proclamation of the readings and the homily, and by discerning the various ways in which God's Word applies to our lives. An important point to remember here is the Second Vatican Council's insight that Christ's presence is recognised in the actual "proclamation" of the Word, when the Church believes that Christ is present and speaking to those assembled through the words of the Church's minister [Sacrosanctum concilium (1963) art. 7], rather than in the physical book itself.

Pope Francis also reminds us that for many centuries before being written down, God's Word was passed down orally from one generation to another. Therefore the actions of proclamation, listening and heeding God's Word are still accorded high priority. Hence the role of the proclaim to do exactly that -"Proclaim"! Not just read. And for the

hearers to "hear", not to be distracted. Hence why we put the text of the Scriptures in the bulletin. But you are encouraged to listen as much as possible to the Proclaimer, and not get too distracted by the bulletin.

Let us embrace Sunday of the Word of God to help us launch our new year with a deeper and richer encounter with the Risen Lord.
