A WORD FROM FR BERNIE

Lots of things give us joy and happiness in our lives. Fine food and drink in a pleasant setting, a great movie, a day watching our favourite sport, or a special occasion where we dress to impress and catch up with friends.

When we reflect on the Gospel reading for Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent which it opens - with the call to humble fasting, prayer and works for God, the tendency might be to become suspicious of those things in life which give us enjoyment especially if they are a little ostentatious. If something is pleasurable or obviously entertaining, then maybe we should distrust such activities lest they distract us from the serious business of religious devotion. The truth is more complex and deeper than that.

The readings of the Ash Wednesday liturgy point to a recognition that is often not what activity is being performed that matters, but how, to what end and with what sort of inner disposition it is being done. Indeed, numerous times through the scriptures we are reminded that all of creation, as well as our place in it, is good and pleasing.

So don't get confused with the goodness of God and what you wish to do in order to make

your Lent a time of renewal and prayer. The readings of Lent remind us that prayer, fasting and good works open us up to a goodness and happiness that helps us to understand God's intentions for creation and how through God we become better and faithful people.

He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison. In former times these did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water.

Baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you - not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.
